

Assessment & Intervention Center



The Assessment & Intervention Center (AIC) is a first-of-its-kind facility and the flagship of Mayor Joe Hogsett's criminal justice reform efforts.

The AIC aims to divert non-violent, low-level offenders by providing mental health and addiction assessments and referrals to appropriate treatment and community services as an alternative to arrest.

Sandra Eskenazi Mental Health Center operates the facility and provides 24/7 programming to address mental health, addiction, homelessness and other socio-economic issues influencing an individual's overall health and well-being.

Referrals are welcomed from a variety of sources including law enforcement and corrections, homeless shelters and outreach programs, emergency departments, primary care centers, as well as self-referral.



The AIC builds upon the incredible work that the Reuben Engagement Center (REC) has done since its inception in 2017 to increase its services, including the ability to provide mental health assessment, and expand its reach for the intended population.

As the next iteration of REC, the AIC is a voluntary program that serves individuals with apparent behavioral health and/or substance use issues where law enforcement is trying to avoid an arrest stemming from a variety of situations.

Core services include:

- 24/7 referrals/intakes
- Assessment by a licensed mental health clinician, paramedic or nurse, and resource coordinator
- Withdrawal management
- Skills training
- Daily goal development engagement
- Access and referral to treatment/needed resources
- Warm hand-offs to referred providers

The AIC opened on Dec. 1, 2020 and is part of the new Community Justice Campus located in the Twin Aire neighborhood of Indianapolis. For referrals, please call 317.327.8733.
